Take the total amount of quality points and divide it by the total number of credits attempted.

$$\frac{\text{Quality Points}}{\text{Credit Hours Attempted}} = \text{Predicted GPA}$$

*Use the following chart below to calculate the GPA you need next semester to rise above probation status.*

**Step 1**

Add the total number of credits attempted at Marist to the number of credits you will attempt next semester. (Exclude credits with grades of W, P, NC, U and any class that has been excluded due to a repeat)

**Step 2**

Multiply Step 1 answer by 2.0 to get the total Quality points you need by the end of next semester.

X	2.0	=GPA desired
		= Quality Points needed

**Step 3**

Subtract your current Quality points from the total Quality points you need to achieve a 2.0 GPA (Your Quality Points can be found on your grade report)

**Step 4**

Divide this difference by the number of credits you are attempting this semester.

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*This calculation does not take into account courses that you have repeated.*

This is the GPA you need at the end of the semester to reach an overall 2.0 GPA
